Synonym

• Sword bean, Japanese jack bean, Dao Dou

Area of cultivation

• India (Maharashtra and Karnataka States), Africa-Tropics

Origin

• Difficult to specify but may be Tropical Asia

Botany description

- Sword bean is a perennial leguminous crop mainly cultivated in tropical and warm temperate Asia.
- It is usually grown as an annual crop.
- Leaves are shiny.
- Pod becomes 30cm long and 5cm wide.
- It contains 10-14 seeds.
- Seeds are elliptical and reaches 3cm long

Uses

- Sword bean is usually grown as a fodder, green manure or as a cover crop.
- The young pods and beans are extensively used as vegetables in tropical Asia Medicinal Uses
 - To warm the stomach and check its upward adverse movement

Management

- Season
 - o June-July, Sep-Oct, Feb-Mar
- Variety
 - o SBS 1,
 - o Seed weight -1.30gm/seed
- Seed rate
 - o 110-120kg (pure crop)
- Spacing
 - o 45 x 30 0r 30 x 20cm
- Fertilizer
 - \circ 25 50 0 NPK kg /ha
